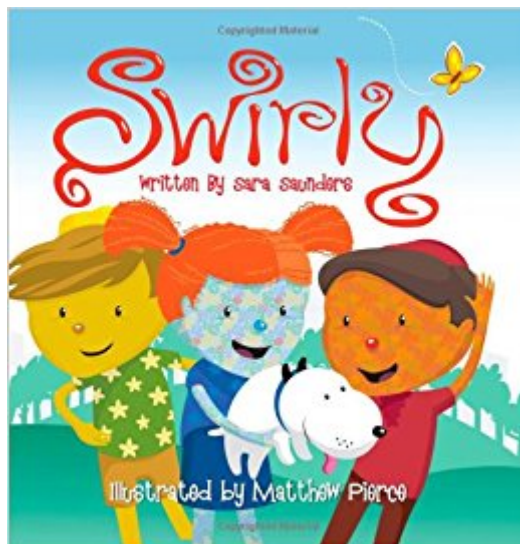


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# Swirly

What happens when we grow up in a different culture from our birth culture? Swirly is a wonderful illustrated story of a girl who has to navigate the cultural differences between her family and her host culture. This book explores the emotional ride of being a TCK ("third culture kid"), as the main character learns who she is and how she fits into the world around her. While this book is perfect for TCKs or expat families, it's great for anyone anywhere. The moment you step out of your family of origin, you hit cultural difference, however small they may be. Your best friend's family isn't the same as yours, with different rules, values, etc. Swirly helps us take a peek into what it means to define ourselves in the midst of cultural differences and appreciate those differences.
