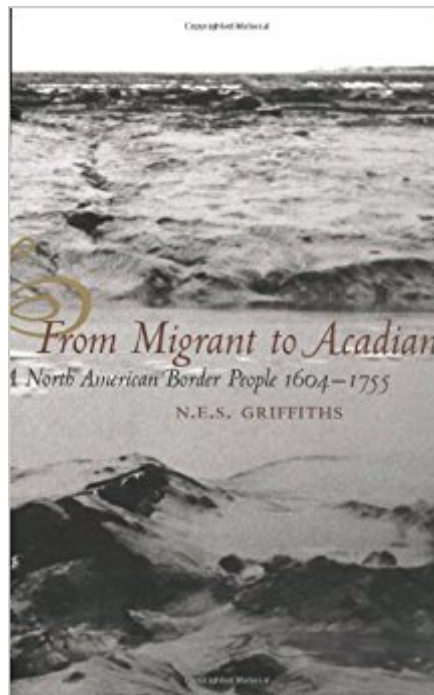


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From Migrant To Acadian: A North American Border People, 1604-1755
