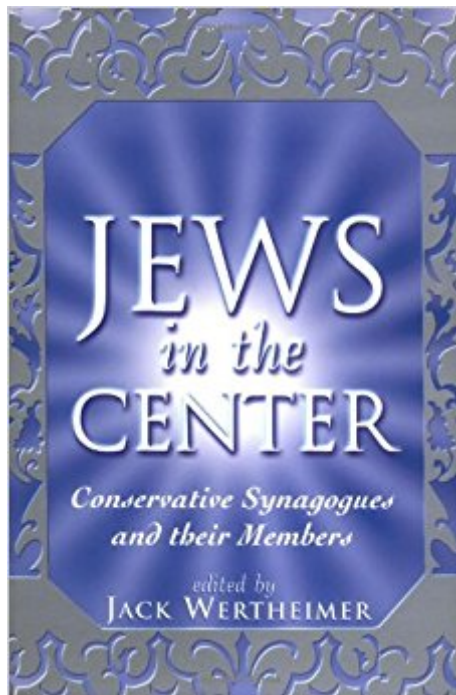

"Jews in the Center" includes sociological and religious descriptions of Conservative congregations, as well as more philosophical discussions of the nature of modern Judaism. The book repeatedly returns to the theme of commitment: the extent to which practicing Jews must dedicate themselves to their faith, and the cycles they go through at different points in life.
