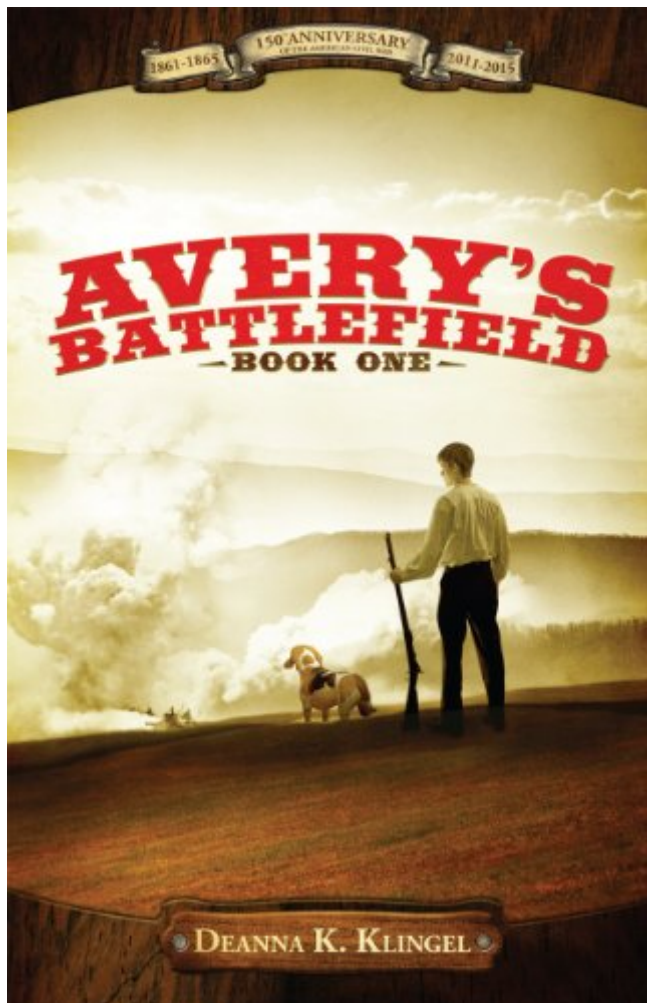


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Avery's Battlefield

This is the kind of book I would have devoured as a young kid (tween and teen years). Taking place during the Civil War years, the main character being a teenage boy who went adventuring. This is the story of Avery Junior Bennet, he leaves his home at the start of the Civil War to go find his Uncle to bring him back to his Aunt who is expecting their first child. The reason Avery decides to do this is because both his father and older brother are gone, and he feels compelled as the Man of the house to protect his aunt, very noble feelings and one I think are good. During Avery's travels he utilizes the medical skills his mother has taught him his whole life, he has a talent for medicine and his grandfather was one of Boston's great doctors. So Avery makes himself indispensable and ends up working in a hospital in Alexandria Virginia, where he asks the wounded soldiers about his uncle. On his way to Alexandria he runs into an old flame of his aunts who is a General and helps ease Avery's way and looks out for the boy to the best of his ability. Eventually Avery finds out about his

uncle and then returns to his family. With plans to return to Alexandria the following spring to help out at the hospital and then in the fall to enter a medical school in Richmond. The characters are likable, and with the exception of sending a 14/15 year old boy out into the world during a war, fairly realistic. I like the fact that Avery and his family were not perfect, they exhibited human emotions like fear, anger and temper. But they also were shown trying to master those emotions, to always try to do your best, and to realize that when times are at the worst to not forget prayer. Having a 15 year old son myself I do not see him being as mature as Avery was portrayed and being able to handle the travel and hardships that Avery faced. But that I think is the mother in me, and a sign of the times I do believe that during that time period children matured faster. I highly recommend this book to anyone who enjoys the Civil War period, and adventure stories with young teens.
